Street Improvements/Upcoming Construction

Garland City will commence construction of the Storm Water Improvement Project on West Factory Street – Phase 2, starting May 28th, 2024. The project includes various tasks such as installing storm drain systems, replacing utilities, roadway excavation, and landscaping. During construction, West Factory Street will be open to local traffic only, with intermittent closures between 1400 West and the railroad tracks. Construction will occur during normal working hours, Monday to Friday, with efforts to minimize inconvenience. The project is expected to conclude by the end of October 2024.
